20. Disease Control/Health

20.1 Diseases

Medical Safety **20.1.001**

(15 minutes) AIDS, HIV, Hepatitis C and Tuberculosis have all reached epic proportions within the corrections industry. This tape reviews the major blood-borne pathogens affecting inmates, officers and staff.

20.3 Bloodborne Pathogens

Silent War 2nd Edition, Infection Control for Emergency Responders **20.3.009**

(480 minutes) For emergency first responders, the risk of being exposed to communicable diseases while on the job is real and serious. Silent War: Second Edition helps reduce this threat by training first responders in all aspects of infection control and by preparing them for anything from patient contact to bioterrorist attacks. Newly updated edition.

20.5 Bioterrorism

Street Officers Do's and Don'ts for Handling Anthrax **20.5.001**

(15 minutes) The threat of bio-terrorism is now a real threat in America. The law enforcement officer is the first line of defense. This video is designed to help officers understand what they are dealing with Anthrax and how to protect themselves and citizens. Various courses of action to take are discussed.

21. Corrections/Jail

21.1 Juvenile Justice

Supervising Juveniles in Adult Facilities-- C&C **21.1.001**

(16 minutes) This course reviews interacting with juveniles and offers ways to prevent conflicts that can arise in a correctional facility.

21.2 Emergency Procedures

Fire in the Jail **21.2.001**

(15 minutes) This realistic dramatization illustrates basic fire fighting skills and procedures with special attention given to the importance of well-defined plans of action and open lines of communication.

Fire Extinguisher Training: Using the P.A.S.S. Technique **21.2.002**

(15 minutes) This program explains basic fire safety as well as the different classes of fire and which extinguishers to use for each. The P.A.S.S. (Pull-Aim-Squeeze-Sweep) technique is demonstrated as well as how to approach each kind of fire and how to install and maintain the extinguishers.

Correctional Emergency Response Team Training: Cell Extraction **21.2.003**

(8 minutes) This program details the complex entry procedure that a Correctional Emergency Response Team (CERT) uses to move an irate prisoner from one cell to another without physical injury to either the inmate or themselves.

Forced Cell Extractions **21.2.004**

(27 minutes) This program presents standard approaches to most cell extraction situations. The techniques, devices and practices demonstrated in the program are good, common correctional practice. The program covers key use of force concerns, liability concerns, medical precautions, standard equipment, various shield techniques and procedures that offer the greatest safety for the officers involved and the inmate offender.

Cell Extraction: a team approach **21.2.005**

(14 minutes) This course studies the preparation and equipment necessary for successful extraction and offers suggestions to reduce liabilities when carrying out this critical action.

Hostage Negotiations **21.2.006**

(20 minutes) This video looks at hostage negotiations within a corrections facility. It explains how to ensure that everyone on staff is prepared when it happens.

Emergency Evacuation of the Facility **21.2.007**

(10 minutes) This video details how to develop plans for the evacuation, how to rehearse and how to be ready should the need for an evacuation ever arise. Whether it's fire, severe weather, or even terrorist activities, facilities need to be prepared to evacuate in a safe, organized and timely manner.

Crisis Management **21.2.008**

(24 minutes) This course covers various topics including hostage negotiations, equipment used, and the debriefing process.

21.3 Security Procedures

Interior Security Procedures **21.3.001**

(18 minutes) This program outlines interior inspection procedures for a corrections facility. Inspection procedures covered in the program include: conducting regular and complete bar taps, checking windows, function of locks, keys, cell block mechanisms, etc.

Managing Inmates in Crowded Conditions **21.3.003**

(24 minutes) This course teaches indicators of crowding, problem areas, and steps to take to prevent crowded conditions from overwhelming the staff and inmates in a correction facility.

Suicide Prevention: A proactive solution **21.3.007**

(18 minutes) This course reviews the warning signs which precede a suicide attempt and portrays the important actions that officers should take if such an attempt is made.

Combative Intake **21.3.008**

(14 minutes) One of the most potentially difficult and dangerous situations in corrections is when a prisoner becomes combative during intake. This tape reviews the issues and situations that lead to combative intake, how officers can help reduce the likelihood of these situations and what actions should and should not be taken to deal with the combative intake.

Crime Scene: Death in a Facility **21.3.010**

(26 minutes) Whether an inmate or an officer, a death in the facility must be handled as a crime scene. This video details how your staff will need to professionally preserve, document and inspect the scene as well as manage the inmates in their care to insure the facility remains safe and secure.

Male Pat Search/Female Pat Search

21.3.011

(14 minutes) This two-part video shows the correct procedures for conducting a systemic, thorough, and professional pat search for weapons and contraband. Part one covers the male pat search, and part two covers pat searches for females.

Clothed Person Searches

21.3.012

(21 minutes) This program describes why, in which situations and exactly how to properly conduct searches of clothed inmates, and defines contra-band-the elimination of which is the object of the search. Also covered are visitor and staff search procedures and the importance of professionalism and consistency. At the end of the program, the viewer will have the opportunity to observe and critique a clothed search.

Unclothed Person Searches

21.3.013

(25 minutes) This program describes the circumstances under which an unclothed search is warranted, exactly how to conduct this type of search on both male and female inmates, defines contraband and describes the importance of professionalism and consistency during each search. At the end of the program, viewers will have the opportunity to observe and critique an unclothed search.

Cell Search Procedures

21.3.014

(15 minutes) Illustrated in this program is the general cell search procedures that can be adapted to the variety of housing situations in correctional facilities. Areas covered include when and how to conduct the search, how contraband is defined and what to do when it is discovered, and the importance of being consistent and professional during each and every cell search.

Vehicle, Area and Building Searches

21.3.015

(12 minutes) This video defines when and how to conduct searches of vehicles, areas and buildings, which inmates come in contact with. Search procedures are outlined step by step, the definition and handling of contraband is discussed, as well as the need to secure visitor areas and parking lots.

Strip Search Training

21.3.016

(35 minutes) One of the most distasteful, dangerous, yet absolutely necessary procedures some officers must undertake is the strip search. In this program, you'll learn how corrections officers at a major prison conduct proper, safe and thorough strip search. This video is in DVD format. **WARNING:** this video contains some partial nudity.

Suicidal Inmates

21.3.017

(22 minutes) This film provides correctional officers with the information they need to identify behaviors that are possible signs of suicide. It shows how to deal with a suicidal inmate and with a suicidal inmate in possession of a weapon.

21.4 Transportation Procedures

Transporting Inmates Safety and Security First

21.4.001

(12 minutes) The greatest risk for escape occurs during prisoner transport. This video examines the need to search inmates before, during and after transport. It reviews what precautions an Officer must take during transport both inside and outside the vehicle.

Jailer Transporting Prisoner is Murdered **21.4.002**

(6 minutes) A jailer transporting a prisoner from one facility to another is shot to death when the subject seizes the female deputy's service weapon from her and opens fire. The lessons are analyzed; the complete report of the incident is included with the roll call presentation. This video is not eligible for TCLEOSE credit unless viewed with two other Roll Call Review Tapes for a total of one hour credit.

Tampa Massacre **21.4.003**

(60 minutes) This video tells the full story of the May, 1998 incident in which wanted felon Hank Earl Carr got the drop on two Tampa homicide detectives and killed them both. He then killed a Florida Highway Patrol Officer before killing himself. The incident was fraught with important training issues, including handcuffing, prisoner transport policies, search procedure and dealing with the media.

Prisoner Transport/Video A Cop's Best Friend **21.4.004**

(32 minutes) This program revolves around the tragic shooting death of a New Mexico deputy who was transporting a prisoner. It will have an in-depth report on the shooting, "lessons learned" and many important safety tips for officers transporting prisoners.

21.5 Communications/Behavior

Conflict Resolution **21.5.001**

(12 minutes) Working in a corrections setting means dealing with conflict every day. This video reviews the steps and skills needed for basic verbal conflict resolution, as well as tips on how to prevent typical situations from becoming confrontational nightmares.

Confrontational Avoidance **21.5.002**

(20 minutes) This video demonstrates to prison staff the correct procedures for resolving confrontations with inmates who have lost control

Con Games Inmates Play **21.5.003**

(22 minutes) This film shows the games inmates play to manipulate correctional officers. Effective techniques of supervision are shown, and their specific effects on control are discussed.

Interpersonal Communications **21.5.004**

(25 minutes) Set in a custody environment, this program demonstrates how an officer's mannerisms and body language can affect the outcome of a situation. Viewers learn specific communications techniques that will make them more effective on the job. Contains language some may find offensive.

Handling Aggressive Inmates **21.5.005**

(21 minutes) Studies show that, sooner or later, every correctional officer will be confronted by an aggressive inmate. This program dramatizes actual confrontations in which officers were injured, and demonstrates how to handle violent inmates.

Interpersonal Communication Skills **21.5.006**

(22 minutes) This course is excellent for providing interpersonal communication skills and building the foundations of respect and cooperation within a correction facility. This program demonstrates both verbal and nonverbal skills to help officers get better results from coworkers and inmates.

Inmate Con Games **21.5.007**

(18 minutes) This course teaches the basics of inmate psychology and some of the most common plays used by inmates to get something they want from officers and other inmates.

Problem Exercises: Staff-Inmate Relations **21.5.008**

(18 minutes) A number of problem situations correctional officers encounter on the job are dramatized. After each situation, the video is stopped and officers are asked to assess the problem and decide how to handle it.

Cultural Diversity in a Corrections Setting **21.5.010**

(19 minutes) This video looks at the various cultures and religions that come together within a corrections facility and how understanding their differences can help corrections officers keep the facility safe and secure.

Non Combative Conflict Resolution **21.5.011**

(18 minutes) This video teaches the basics of inmate psychology and some of the most common ploys used by inmates to get something they want from an officer or other inmates.

Looking for Trouble: Warning Signs **21.5.012**

(19 minutes) From inmate disturbances to escape attempts to con games played on staff, corrections officers need to be prepared to watch for "warning signs" of trouble. This video addresses what to look for to ensure a safe and secure facility.

Inmate Tricks **21.5.013**

(18 minutes) Many inmates in correctional facilities still engage in illegal activities such as drug dealing, murder, and escape. As a result, they have devised very imaginative methods to deceive corrections officers. This program demonstrates several of the ingenious tricks inmates use to hide contraband, self-made weapons, and escape routes. It shows new and experienced officers what to watch out for in their inspections and reminds them to never take anything for granted.

Principles of Discipline **21.5.014**

(22 minutes) Discipline is the means of getting inmates to practice self-control. It is the responsibility of correctional officers to understand and apply the techniques of discipline for the general good, safety and orderliness of the institution.

21.6 Special Needs Inmates

Special Needs Inmates **21.6.001**

(23 minutes) This course reviews procedures to be followed when medication is to be administered and covers staffing and equipment requirements needed at your facility for physically or mentally disabled inmates.

Supervision of Special Inmates **21.6.002**

(20 minutes) This film looks at four major psychological disorders and depicts the characteristics of each. Guidelines for understanding special inmates are provided, as are tips for dealing effectively with them.

21.7 Gangs

Chicago-Based Gangs in Correctional Facilities **21.7.001**

(27 minutes) This important training program takes a look at the history of Chicago-based gangs, lists the

names of their offshoots, discusses the tattoos, handsigns and symbols that are used as identifiers and for communication purposes and explores the mentality and philosophy of leaders and members.

Growth of Gangs **21.7.002**

(16 minutes) This course surrounds the growth of gang-related conflict and violence within a correction setting. The basic psychology of gang members and membership, security issues when gangs clash, as well as preparations officers can make are all discussed.

21.8 Female Prisoners

Working with the Female Offender **21.8.001**

(22 minutes) This program discusses the following factors: family, medical issues and abuse and how they affect the management of the female offender. Employing techniques outlined in the program will make the work experiences of correctional staff more successful and less stressful. It will also make a positive impact on the inmates with which staff members come in contact, enabling the offenders to return to society determined to be productive citizens, instead of criminals.

21.10 Stress

Dealing with Stress **21.10.001**

(21 minutes) This course shows corrections and detentions officers how to recognize and effectively deal with stress in their daily lives.

21.11 Self Defense/Officer Safety

Officer Safety: Correctional Officer Training **21.11.001**

(12 minutes) Familiarity breeds carelessness, and in correction work, even a little carelessness can be fatal. Questions in this program are designed to prompt a thoughtful analysis of how to avoid being a victim.

Corrections/Jailer Safety **21.11.002**

(32 minutes) The program will provide in-depth information and training for corrections officers/jailers regarding safe dealings with inmates/convicts. Part One of a two-part series.

Corrections, Part II **21.11.003**

(31 minutes) In part two, officers gain critical insight into response to jail/prison melees and remaining calm and observant...mental preparation for riot situations... Also, inmate scams on officers are explored which is vital especially for new officers; awareness of inmate lying and subterfuge is examined. Also, complacency, the "nothing happens here mentality" is a focal point of this program. Experts from the maximum security Soledad Prison in California provide the training.

Introduction to Corrections **21.11.005**

(21 minutes) This video includes subjects such as the purpose of corrections, the role of the Corrections Officer, the five elements of custody and the basic procedures of prisoner management.

Handling Prisoners: An Analysis of Officers Killed **21.11.007**

(18 minutes) Through re-creation of actual events, this program uses FBI statistics to document the principal causes of officers killed while handling prisoners. The conditions and circumstances that allowed suspects to successfully attack and kill officers are shown, as are attitudes that may have contributed to officers' deaths.

21.12 Others

Religious and Cultural Diversity in the B.O.P. **21.12.001**

(16 minutes) This video explains how BOP is working to ensure its system is sensitive to the specialized language, dietary, and religious needs of inmates.

Cross Gender Supervision **21.12.002**

(19 minutes) This course teaches the most effective ways to maintain inmates and security within a cross gender facility. Because there are more women working in jails and prisons than ever, officers must be aware of sexual discrimination and sexual harassment laws.

Legal Issues for Corrections Officers **21.12.003**

(23 minutes) This course covers the Bill of Rights, the three branches of government, sexual harassment, and inmate lawsuits.

Inmate Orientation: New Inmate, New Thinking **21.12.004**

(13 minutes) This course will review some potential problems in new inmate acclimation and discusses how to reduce these hazards.

Sexual Harassment **21.12.006**

(14 minutes) This course examines the legal definitions and how this guides individual behavior. A review of how to reduce the risk of liability and how supervisors should react when a claim is made are discussed in this training.

22. Patrol/Street Officers

22.1 Traffic Stops

Trooper Coates Shooting **22.1.002**

(32 minutes) A veteran trooper is killed along a South Carolina highway, despite the fact that he shoots and hits the suspect five times at center mass with his .357 service revolver. This video is a detailed study of the shooting death of South Carolina State Trooper Mark Coates, including summarization's by Trooper Coates' back-up officers.

Coates Killer Interview **22.1.003**

(34 minutes) Richard Blackburn, the convicted killer of South Carolina State Trooper Mark Coates, is interviewed for the first time. Learn from Blackburn's personal insights as to his motivation and state of mind during this tragic incident.

Felony Vehicle Stops **22.1.004**

(30 minutes) This video demonstrates the procedures for stopping cars and vans and what to do when a suspect runs away. The video stresses that the three main concerns of an officer are to control himself, control the suspect and control the situation.

Routine Stops **22.1.005**

(18 minutes) Safe, proper procedures for conducting routine stops recommended by law enforcement agencies for law enforcement training are demonstrated. Officers learn what to do and also observe possible tactical mistakes.

Safe Stops in Traffic / Passenger Side Approach **22.1.006**

(30 minutes) Several incidents in which officers have either been injured or killed are examined. An Idaho deputy, after being nearly struck and killed by an inebriated teenage motorist, analyzes his own response. Also, Jim Crotty demonstrates excellent passenger-side approaches while making traffic stops. This program also looks at some of the innovative web sites used by law enforcement.

Idaho High-Risk Stop / Felony Stop Demonstration **22.1.007**

(35 minutes) This program has two important parts: 1) a follow-up to the previous program (Traffic Safety/Passenger Side Approach), in which Bonner County (ID) Deputy John Lunde is hit by a fleeing motorist. The resulting high-risk stop is studied and analyzed by Lunde and his fellow back-up officers and 2) Jim Crotty of 'Strategies for Officer Survival,' provides a demonstration of a 'textbook' felony vehicle stop with the cooperation of the Brunswick, GA PD.

Officer Survival: Traffic Stops **22.1.008**

(15 minutes) This program identifies and demonstrates effective and practical tactical techniques for increasing personal safety during traffic stops in a variety of circumstances and conditions. This program also identifies warning signs of life-threatening traffic stop situations.

Tinted Window Shooting / Tinted Windows Training **22.1.009**

(30 minutes) Two sheriff's deputies stop a car with tinted windows and are forced to resort to lethal force. Once the subject is stopped the deputies must shoot out the vehicle's tires as it rolls down the highway toward traffic. Excellent analysis and lessons provided by both deputies, who happen to be brothers. Also, Jim Crotty joins the Orange County (FL) Sheriff's Department in demonstrating the best methods of approaching vehicles with tinted windows, both day and night.

High Risk Stops **22.1.010**

(21 minutes) This video illustrates correct, life-protecting procedures with special emphasis on being alert for concealed weapons. Officers will also learn to maintain control by taking complete charge, taking their time, guarding against the unexpected, and varying their routine.

Darrell Lunsford Murder:Lessons Learned **22.1.011**

(7 minutes) The first video recorded murder of a peace officer---the murder of Texas constable Darrell Lunsford is analyzed for lessons learned and edited into a very convenient roll call training program all departments will want for their video library.This video is not eligible for TCLEOSE credit unless viewed with 2 other Roll call Review tapes.

Perpendicular Shoot **22.1.012**

(43 minutes) Sheriff's deputies in North Carolina resort to lethal force after a passenger in a vehicle stopped for erratic driving and lane change violations reaches for a gun. This is an extraordinary incident in which two deputies firing from diagonal positions fatally injure the subject. There are innumerable lessons to be learned regarding safe traffic stops and being prepared for the unexpected.

Large Vehicle Stop/Drug Concealment, Pt. 2 **22.1.013**

(35 minutes) A sheriff's deputy makes a nighttime stop of a speeding truck driver who becomes extremely belligerent, even though he'd been stopped a short time earlier for the same infraction. In-depth interview with the contact officer. Additionally, complete analysis and review of this very tense situation, its outcome, and many lessons learned. Backup features more on sophisticated drug hiding places in vehicles.

Officer Tries to Block Moving Car/Verbal Judo Refresher **22.1.014**

(34 minutes) A highway patrol officer stands in front of a stopped subject's car ordering the individual not to proceed. When the subject, however DOES continue driving forward, the officer draws his service weapon and fires numerous times at the fleeing individual striking him.

Hit and Run **22.1.015**

(29 minutes) A South Carolina State Trooper was nearly killed by a drunken motorist while he was on the side of a highway making a traffic stop. Also, a Georgia State Trooper is severely injured by a drunken motorist while in the process of citing a motorist during a late-night traffic stop. Critical issues analyzed and explored.

Complacency Leads to Tragedy **22.1.016**

(6 minutes) A female deputy is held at gunpoint while checking on a man supposedly asleep in his car. Dramatic video and lessons learned. This is a "Roll Call Review" video which means that it is not available for TCLEOSE credit unless viewed with two other Roll Call Review Videos for a total of one credit hour.

Connecticut Trooper Shooting **22.1.017**

(44 minutes) A Connecticut officer has less than four seconds to decide what to do when a subject he had been pursuing jumps out of his car and lunges at the officer with a tire iron. In an instant, the officer had to decide whether to use lethal force. This video is in DVD format.

Physical Assaults: Covering Your Back **22.1.019**

(7 minutes) With graphic video of officers who have been violently physically assaulted, technical advisers pass along invaluable safety and survival tips to officers. This video is a "Roll Call Review" video and is not available for TCLEOSE credit unless viewed with two other Roll Call Review Tapes for a total of one hour credit.

Trooper Knife Fight **22.1.020**

(33 minutes) Georgia State Trooper is involved in a knife fight with an ex-offender at a truck stop. This incident will prove the immeasurable value of preparation and training for the unexpected, of which all officers must be aware.

Iron Will To Survive #2: Blinded Trooper **22.1.021**

(39 minutes) Iron Will to Survive-Part II features the story of survival and rehabilitation of a Louisiana state trooper, blinded by a gunshot injury and his incredible fight back. This video is in DVD format.

***** NEW *** Utah Crusier Stolen** **22.1.022**

(29 minutes) In this video, an incident is examined where a deputy on a traffic stop makes a series of choices resulting in his cruiser being stolen by a fleeing suspect. What would you do in the same situation? Various tactical procedures for traffic stops are included. In DVD format.

***** NEW *** Michelle Jeter Beatin** **22.1.023**

(35 minutes) warning: this video depicts real life violence captured on in-car recorder. Officer Michelle Jeter of Carthage, Texas was brutally beaten and left for dead after a traffic stop. In this video, she describes the incident and lessons learned. In DVD format.

***** NEW *** Multi-Crash Response/When One Incident Becomes Several** **22.1.024**

(30 minutes) Snowy conditions on a Utah highway result in a slide-off accident, then a second, then a third that comes too close for safety for the troopers working the scene. This video addresses how to deal with multi-incident situations.

22.2 Search and Seizure

Missed Weapons Lead to Officer Deaths **22.2.001**

(35 minutes) The training story of a great arrest by two St. Louis officers which turned tragic---when they missed a weapon on a patdown. The video details the arrest of a cop shooter and his subsequent murder of one of the arresting officers. This program also features complete and thorough patdown training.

Drug Concealment Spots **22.2.002**

(16 minutes) Drug concealment spots are analyzed and graphically presented in this video. This program also includes some of the tactics drug runners are using to get over and get past police officers. This video is not eligible for TLCEOSE hours unless reviewed with two other Roll Call Review tapes for a total of 1 TCLEOSE hour.

***** NEW *** Missed Patdown Horror Story 22.2.003**

(40 minutes) This program illustrates the dangers of relaxed patdown and body search procedures. A man being questioned after a shooting a police officer brings a hidden .45 into an interrogation room and shoots himself. In DVD format.

22.3 Emergency In Progress/Non-Traffic

Robbery in Progress: An Analysis of Officers Killed 22.3.001

(14 minutes) This program discusses officers who were killed responding either to armed robberies in progress or to situations involving armed robbery suspects.

Man with Gun Calls: An Analysis of Officers Killed 22.3.002

(14 minutes) This program recreates actual cases where officers were killed answering Man with Gun calls. The circumstances that allowed suspects to kill officers are illustrated, as are factors on both sides that may have contributed to officers' death.

Burglaries in Progress: An Analysis of Officers Killed 22.3.003

(15 minutes) This program recreates actual cases where officers were killed answering burglary-in-progress calls.

Police Face Man with Explosive Device 22.3.004

(41 minutes) A mentally deranged man attempts to firebomb the house where his estranged wife is staying. Police confront him and he detonates an explosive device in a gas station.

Handling a School Shooting 22.3.005

(15 minutes) In this program, a portrayal of a school shooting depicting the real risks involved in these types of situations gives officers the information they need to survive and ensure the safety and survival of other officers and innocent victims.

Suspicious Person Calls: An Analysis of Officers Killed 22.3.006

(17 minutes) This program examines cases in which law enforcement officers were killed while investigating suspicious person/circumstances calls.

Brentwood Bank Robbery and Shootout/Weapons Concealment 22.3.007

(49 minutes) Dramatic video of Tennessee bank robbery from two different cruiser cameras and officers fatally wounding robber. Issues raised include cover and concealment.

22.4 Communications/Behavior

Diffusing Aggressive Behavior 22.4.001

(18 minutes) This program dramatizes confrontational situations to point out the dangers in dealing with people who are upset or out of control. Gives officers a clear course of action to reduce the individual's desire to attack. Discusses proper stance, use of backup, and taking control of the subject.

Tactical Communication Skills 22.4.002

(29 minutes) This program presents five scenarios designed to enhance an officer's communication skills. They include how to personalize an encounter, acknowledge a victim's emotions, provide options to defuse a situation, handle explosive situations and develop an ability to express feelings in order to relieve stress.

Verbal Judo / Body Language (Part Two) 22.4.004

(38 minutes) It's called "martial arts for the mouth" and is yet another weapon in the street officer's arsenal. George Thompson has a national reputation for teaching officers how to communicate with subjects in a manner, which will maximize compliance, and minimize risk. This video also includes a tutorial on recognizing potentially dangerous body language.

What Every Street Cop Needs to Know about Body Language 22.4.005

(7 minutes) Subjects who are potentially violent almost invariably display various physical "signs" that they are volatile. However, many cops simply have never been taught or shown these simple physical displays of anxiety or anger. 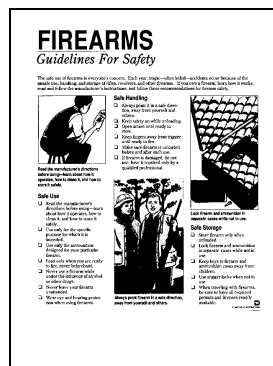

24. Administrative Issues

24.1 Dispatcher/Communications

Staying Calm Under Pressure: Dispatching **24.1.002**

24.3 Community/Public Relations

Dealing with the Media **24.3.001**

(38 minutes) The Washington sniper case, a civil disturbance, an airline crash... all examples of how an unexpected event can bring a wave of media attention. Law enforcement is often the target of media attention during such times. This is an extensive examination of how law enforcement can respond effectively at such times includes experts in journalism and law enforcement public information specialists. 25.1 Ethics
